Opening Prayer

[You may wish to light a candle, get out a nativity set, or look up a picture of the nativity scene as you say these prayers.]

God of the manger, God of the shepherds, God of the angels - I worship you this day.

I worship a God who came to a young woman in Nazareth, in unknowable ways, and who made the impossible possible and who made the incomprehensible happen, a God who became a tiny baby boy, who contracted infinite power and strength into a fragile, feeble and dependent human life.

I worship a Christmas God.

I stand with the angels.

I stand in the presence of God.

The Christmas God who came, you are also the God who comes - today, now, into my life. I, like John the Baptist, look for ways I can prepare the way for you to come. I seek to know you more, and to do your will in the world around us.

I have failed, I have fallen short, but I know something of the peace, the acceptance, the warmth of the Advent God.

This day, I look to your coming Lord,

I stand with the angels.

I stand in the presence of an ordinary, extraordinary God.

Amen.

Responding to the reading

How might it feel to stand in the presence of God? If you did, would it change the way you think about yourself, your choices, your hopes, your energy-levels, your plans and the way you live your life? Move amongst those times, that the conversations I am a part of will be rich and spirit-filled, that my actions will show peace and love, that my revolution of hope can begin again, for the sake of your kingdom.

I pause now to pray for all those we will encounter this Christmas season...

Prayers and Prayer Pointers for the Week Ahead

Monday 18th December

- Even if you have already been at a Christingle service this year, you might like to say the words at home, perhaps making an effort to share them with someone in your family or neighbourhood.
- You could even make your own Christingle and set it in the windowsill for the next few days, helping you to think about the world, the injustices and unfairness of the world and God's desire for every person's potential to be fulfilled.

Tuesday 19th December

God of all grace, God of the Christmas season, Show me how to share the hope of the Christmas story with those around me this year, in conversation, in the giving and receiving of gifts, in the way I live my life. Help me to be a guardian and an evangelist for your good news this year. Amen.

Wednesday 20th December

- Light a candle. As you watch the flame flicker, think about the parts of your life, your community, our world, that need to know something of the light of the world. You might like to pray this prayer:

Lord of Light, shine into the darkness in me, the darkness in this community, the darkness in our world. In the midst of all that is frightening and cold and uncertain, come Prince of Peace. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. Amen.

Thursday 21st December

- Today, let us pray for all who will be working over the Christmas period all those key workers who keep our society going.
- If that's you, take a moment for yourself today.
- If it's someone you know, maybe drop them a text or give them a call to thank them and let them know you will be praying for them.

Friday 22nd December

- Pray for all who feel excluded, sad or lonely this Christmas season. As you pray, listen for a prompting about something you might be invited to do to reach out to someone in need.

Saturday 23rd December

- As we get closer to Christmas, it's likely that some of the 'usual' rhythms are coming to an end for a few days as the world moves into 'holiday mode'. Perhaps you are travelling, or seeing friends, or finishing work for a few days.
- Why not make use of this Christmas mantra today repeat it as often as you can: in the car, at the sink, when you have a moment to yourself on the sofa. As you repeat the mantra, listen to the words but also to how they change you, how they are a prayer:
- Christmas God, be born in my heart this year. Amen.
